The Power of the Rosary

St.PopeJohn Paul II in his 2002 Apostolic Letter, "On the Most Holy Rosary," quotes Pope Leo XIII's words, "The rosary is an effective <u>spiritual weapon</u> against the evils affecting society."

The month of October like May is dedicated to Our Lady, specifically, to OurLady of the Rosary!

In the **Holy Rosary**, we greet**Mary** with "Ave Maria"—Hail

Maryand the numerous **Hail Mary's** offered during **Rosary** can
be likened to offeringto Mary a"wreath of roses."

The word "rosary" in Latin is "Rosarium" literally meaning a"wreath or a crown of roses."

Therefore, every time we pray the "rosary" we are actually offering to Mary,Our Heavenly Mother, a "wreath of roses." That is, a "beautiful "crown of roses!"

According to **Catholic tradition**, the **Rosary** was instituted by the **Blessed Virgin Mary herselfwhen She introduced it to St. Dominic in the 13**th **century.**

By the **15th century**, the**Rosary** was **declared** as an approved universal **Church prayer**. The **Dominicans** enthusia stically spread the**devotion** of **praying the Rosary**.

The Rosary"focuses" on the life of Jesus through Mary!We find this in the Gospel of St. Luke. Pope St. Pius V structured the Rosary around the 15 mysteries, and on October 7, 1571, heinstituted the Feast of Our Lady of Victory, which later became known as the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary!

Why this Feast and why on this particular day, October 7th?

A little <u>historical</u> background is first needed. In

1571,Christianity was <u>saved</u>at theBattle of Lepanto.

Christian Europe had been <u>threatened</u> with ruin and slavery by the Ottoman Empire, ruled by an Islamic Sultan. Pope

Pius V arranged a Crusade to battle withthis Empire whose naval fleet was muchlarger and <u>stronger</u>.

The Pope <u>implored</u> urgentlythe faithful to pray the Rosary!
Our Lady heard and answered their fervent prayer, resulting in a major victory for the smaller and weaker Christianfleet.

Pope Pius V in thanksgiving for this great victory
established on October 7th, the Feast of Our Lady
Victory, which later became known as the Feast of Our Lady of
Rosary. Since 1571 to this very day, Popes down the centuries
have encouraged the faithful to pray the Holy Rosary. For
example, we have Pope St. Leo XIII.

He isknown as "The Rosary pope," and he once stated: "I amconvinced that the Rosary, if devoutly used, is bound to benefit not only the individual but society at large."

<u>Pope Pius XI</u> also encouraged the praying of the Rosary, when in 1937, <u>two years before</u> the beginning of the War World II foresaw the wave of National Socialism (Nazism) and the political ideology of <u>Joseph Stalin</u>, marked by a mass religious persecution.

By praying the **Rosary** at home, **Pope Pius** added,"it will serve to overcome the enemies of God and Religion."

Then, in **2002**, **Pope St. John Paul II** added **fivenew mysteries**, called the **Luminous Mysteries**.

They completed the Public lifeofChrist Jesus. These mysteries focus on those three-years of Our Savior's Ministry for Salvation of Souls. Pope St. John Paul II once wrote: "To recite the Rosary is nothing other than to contemplate with Mary the face of Christ."

<u>Pope Francis</u>, in our modern times, as the **Church**continues to face**various and challenges and crises**, askedthe **faithful** to pray the **Rosary** daily!

Also, during his **pontificate**, the **Pope**has popularized the powerful **Marian devotion** of <u>Our Lady of Undoer of</u>

<u>Knots</u>. This call topray the Rosaryhas been the central theme of **Our Lady** in all her apparitions over the centuries.

But in the unforgettable apparition at Fatima, Portugal, on

October 13, 1917, She identified Herselfto the three shepherd

childrenunder this title: "I am the Lady of the Rosary!"

She<u>encouraged</u>themto <u>pray</u>and offer<u>sacrifices</u>for the conversionof sinners.Our Heavenly Motherexhorted them:

"Recite the rosary every day to obtain the peace for the world and the end of the war."

Can you imagine that by **praying** this simple **prayer** known as the **Holy Rosary"peace"** will befall on the world bringing the end of **wars and conflicts!** We need to pray the **Rosary** especially in these times of conflicts and wars around the world.

If some of you are <u>not</u> in the practice of **praying a dailyrosary**, I would **encourage** you to simply begin by praying just "one decade" a day. That is, 1 Our Father, 10 Hail

Mary's and one Glory Be, for <u>three</u>specific intentions: *for your needs, for your family needs and for world peace!*

How powerful is the prayer of the Rosary?

Recently I came across a correspondence of an **Italian exorcist** who was praying over a possessed person on the **Feast Day ofOur Lady of the Rosary** and **commanded** the **demon** afflicting the person to confess on the power of**Our Lady's Rosary**. Of course, demons have great difficulty to speak about her because she possesses what they lack: **purity, humility, and obedience**.

They cannot even pronounce her name **Mary**, instead they refer to **Our Blessed Mother** as **"her" as "she" or "that woman."** Anyway, during the sessions three affirmations emerged which underscore the power of the **HolyRosary**.

One, the demon confessed, "That even when someone just simply holds it (the rosary) in their hand, it bothers me. I cannot stand it!"

Two, headmitted, "the person that prays the Rosary in the familyhas a particular protection by Her (Mary) and 'we cannot enter' into that house. God does not permit that!"

The third confession that the demon was forced to make is the mostastoundingwhen he admitted the following:

"In that family even if only <u>ONE</u> person prays the Rosary, such a person can <u>save</u> the <u>rest</u> of the family."

This should give each of us the encouragement to keep on praying even if we are praying alone in our family.

I will close with <u>two quotes</u> from <u>two well-known priests</u> who **loved** praying the **Rosary** and spreading its **devotion**:

First, *Fr Patrick Peyton's, the Rosary priest,* who encouraged <u>family</u> <u>prayer</u>, especially the *Rosary*, who often said:

"The family that prays together stays together."

Second, from a great priest and saint who loved **Our Lady** so much that he prayed many, many, rosaries daily, who said: "Some people are so foolish that they thinkthey can gothrough life without the help of the Blessed Mother.

Love the Madonna and pray the Rosary,

for Her Rosary is the <u>weaponagainst the evils</u> of the world today. All graces given by God pass through the Blessed Mother."
